More trees were snapped and twisted as the tornado moved across the southeast side of Midway. The tornado then moved in a more easterly direction where it caused minor damage to two homes, uprooted two dozen more trees and snapped additional smaller trees near the intersection of County Road 957 and County Road 992 before lifting.
